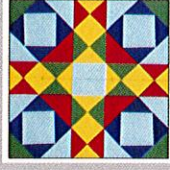




3065 Shawnee Road, Wellsville

Lewis & Clark The property has been in the family since 1966. The barn was built around 1922. Corn, soybeans, wheat and beef cattle are produced on the farm.

Wren The property has been in the family more than 100 years, with the sixth generation now on the farm. The farm grows soybeans and hay. The barn, built around 1935, originally was a dairy barn.

Laurie *Cand Trick* The barn was built in 2003 for a woodshop. The farm produces hay. The color scheme was chosen because the owners are Kansas State University alumni.

The Boss The Mace family purchased this farm from the original quilt block owners in 2015. The barn was built in 1925 and rebuilt in 2000.

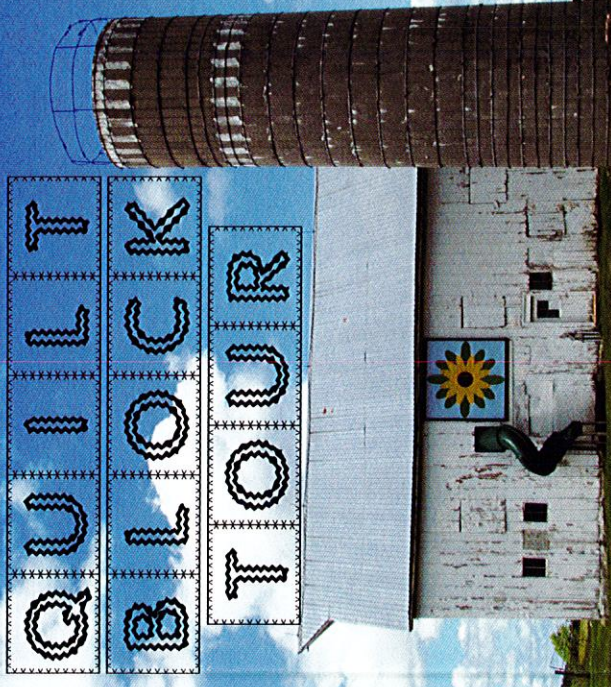

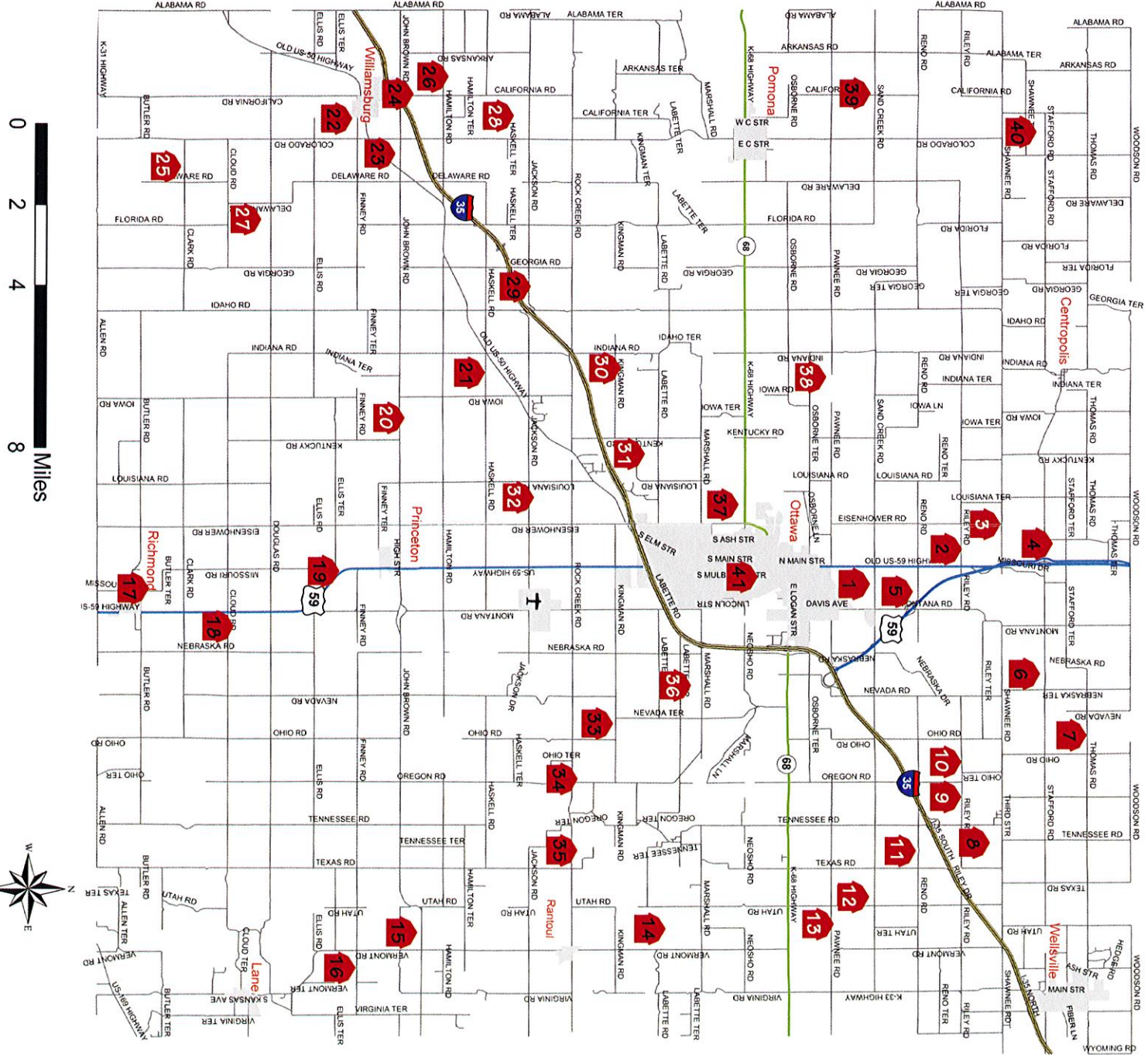

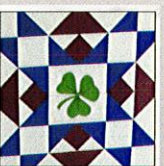

 4636 Ohio Road, Wellsville
Radiant Star Variation The property has been in the family since 1855, but when the owners moved there in 2005, no buildings were standing. They love Paso Fino horses. The farm grows soybeans, corn and wheat.

Patch Apples The property has been in the family since 1961. The building, used for equipment storage and grain, was built in 1972. The farm grows apples, peaches, pears, cherries and apricots.



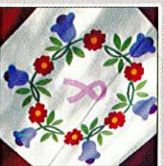

Nosagay Roberta's grandparents purchased the property in 1948. During World War II, prisoners of war worked on the farm. The block is a tribute to her mother.

Star Spangled The property has been in the family since 1896. Red, white and blue represent four generations of family men in the military, and the shamrock celebrates their Irish ancestry.

 3712 Texas Road, Ottawa
Sawduster The block combines two hobbies, Kansas history and quilting. They operated a registered Holstein farm and dairy until 1998. The farm houses three generations and produces soybeans, corn, wheat and hay.

 4211 Pawnee Road, Wellsville
Bridal Wreath The property was purchased in 1959. At age 29, Beth was diagnosed with breast cancer. The family is thankful for her survival and wants everyone to know early detections saves lives.

Four Block Star The owners purchased the property in 2003. Cattle and pasture are the focus of the farm. The quilt block pattern was chosen for its 3D look.



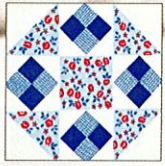

 2710 Vermont Road, Rantoul
Eagle with Trees & Pumpkin The property has been in the family since 1985, with the barn built in 1912. The farm operates as a pumpkin patch and tree farm October through December.

Guide Path The barn originally was a milk barn and was rebuilt for horses. The business offers therapeutic horseback riding to individuals with disabilities. The block was donated by a mother who lost her son to cancer.

Variation of Indiana Star The property has been in the family for more than 40 years. The farm grows corn, milo and soybeans. The pattern represents the owner's Indiana heritage.

Richmond Community Museum
 119 ED. Central St., Richmond
Richmond Star The building originally was a lumberyard and now houses a museum. One of the items on display is the Richmond Star quilt, made by Edith Hornberger in 2000, a project started in Richmond, Va.



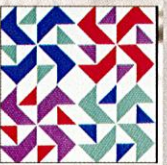

Feathered Star The block is from the owner's grandmother's quilt. The barn protects seed, supplies and equipment. The farm grows wheat, soybeans and corn.

 2832 Ellis Road, Princeton
Double Wedding Ring The block honors the couple's 40th wedding anniversary and was installed before their daughter's wedding. They grow corn, wheat, soybeans and raise cattle. (Best viewed from Highway 59)

Olberding
 1312 Kentucky Road, Princeton
North Star The property has been in the family since 1893. The barn was built from several barns the owners tore down in Axtell, KS, where he grew up. The farm grows corn, soybeans, sunflowers and oats.

Medina
 1797 Indiana Road, Williamsburg
Vankoe Puzzle The property has been in the family more than 50 years. The original barn was replaced more than 20 years ago. It is used for shelter for cows and to store hay. The farm grows corn and soybeans.

Worden Ranch
 1268 Colorado Road, Williamsburg
Ganoke Star The property has been in the family for more than 20 years and includes 160 acres of grassland. The design represents the owner's American Indian heritage. (Best viewed from Finney Road)



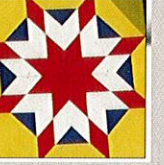

 705 Finney Road, Williamsburg
Aurora's Star The farmhouse, barn and other buildings were built in 1880. The owner's great-grandmother, Aurora, made a quilt in the 1930s from scraps of her daughter's dresses. (Best viewed from Colorado Road)

Williamsburg Community Museum
 309 S. East St., Williamsburg
Kansas The stone church was purchased in 2000 to house community artifacts. When the museum needed to grow, the barn was built in 2010 to display more exhibits and local history.

 894 Clark, Williamsburg
High Grain The Family celebrates their Irish heritage with the Irish Chain block. The house and barn were built in 1910.

Lindskog/Curtis
 1660 California Road, Pomona
Harvest Star The barn dates back to the 1930s. The 40 acre farm mainly is used as pasture. The block was chosen for the family's Swedish heritage.

Davis
 1009 Cloud Road, Williamsburg
Grandmother's Flower Garden The original barn was built in 1905, blew down in 1974 and was rebuilt in 1975. The farm produces wheat, corn, soybeans, sorghum and hay.

Duvall
 1954 Colorado Road, Pomona
Four Seasons The block represents four generations of ownership and the four seasons. The farm produces wheat, milo, soybeans, cattle and Jo Ann's farm cats.

Pome on the Range
 2050 Idaho Road, Williamsburg
McAnoga Star Pome on the Range Orchards & Winery offers apples, peaches, berries and seasonal vegetables. The produce is grown, picked and sold at the business.

Sylvester Ranch
 1792 Kingman Road, Ottawa
Desden Plate The property has been in the family since 1965. The building was built in 1966, though the storefront is the original from the general store in Milford, KS. The farm grows soybeans, corn and wheat.



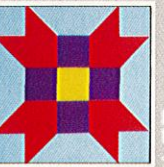

Wedgewood Tails The design is important to the landowner because it was her mom's favorite quilt she made, which made it to the state fair. (Best viewed traveling south on Kentucky Road)

Campbell
 2037 Louisiana Road, Ottawa
Redding Pator to Pay Paul Featuring the Campbell brand, this block is the only one on the tour hung on a silo. This silo is the only structure remaining from the original farmstead.

Ferguson Memorial Farm
 3493 Rock Creek Road, Ottawa
Dawdle Windmill The property has been in the family since 1967. The barn originally was used to store hay. The owners grown soybeans, wheat, hay and raise cattle.

Spencer Farms
 2246 Ohio Terrace, Ottawa
Farmer's Daughter The barn, built in 2006 for Lucille and Ron Spencer, houses equipment, grain and offices. The property has been in the family since 1976. The farm grows corn, wheat and soybeans.

 3960 Rock Creek Road, Ottawa
Farmer's Wife Linda grew up a farm girl and married a part-time farmer, which grew into a full-time business with three generations working on the farm. (Best viewed heading west on Rock Creek Rd)



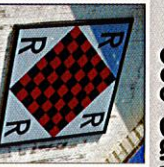

 2729 Nebraska Road, Ottawa
Kansas Star The property has been in the family since 2007. The barn is more than 110 years old and originally was used for milking cows and housing equipment.

 1446 S. Eisenhower Ave., Ottawa
Ag Works/Our Farm Products In the family since 1910, the farm grows corn, beans, milo, wheat, alfalfa and brome and is a dairy operation. (Best viewed heading south on Eisenhower)

Alderman
 2010 Osborne Terrace, Ottawa
Milkmaid Star The property has been in the family for four generations, and a working dairy until 2003. The farm produces corn, soybeans and wheat. The owners chose milkmaid star for the farm's history.

Reed
 506 Sand Creek Road, Pomona
Country Checkers The barn was built in 1932. The farm produces corn, soybeans, wheat and milo. The quilt's pattern reflects Roy's love of checkers. (Must be viewed from California Road)

Wilson
 675 Shawnee Road, Pomona
Sunbonnet Sue The block was chosen because of the couple's daughter whose first quilt was a Sunbonnet Sue. The middle name Sue is also common in the family.

Mitchell
 703 S. Princeton, Ottawa
Carolina Lily The block is hung on an original carriage house designed to house horses, wagons, tack and feed. It has been refurbished and now houses the owners' motorcycles.
